Course Objectives & Learning Outcomes:

The first three days of this course will cover the Design Organisation Approval (DOA) key concept by EASA experts. The fourth day will cover the local airworthiness requirements in HKAR-21 and Hong Kong Civil Aviation Department (HKCAD) DOA by local experts.

(i) 12-14 March 2019 (By EASA)

The DOA key concepts will be presented by EASA experts:

- 1) Key regulatory elements
- 2) Demonstration of capability for design
- 3) EASA internal working procedures
- 4) Introduction to DOA
- 5) Part 21 Subpart J

(ii) 15 March 2019 (By Local Subjects Matter Experts)

The objective is to meet the HKCAD Course Specifications for “Basic HKAR-21 Training Course” and “DOA (HKAR-21) Training Course” under HKAR-2. The local regulation and requirements will be covered by the Hong Kong design and aircraft certification local experts on this day. HKCAD officers will be invited to attend discussion panels to provide their official views on local DOA policy matters.
